

"Winter Interest" Landscape Design - #4 in a series of sample landscape designs

Many plants in the landscape are popular for their spring, summer or fall characteristics. But what about winter interest? A landscape in winter may never be as showy as it is in the warmer months, but winter brings a peacefulness to the landscape, especially after a new fallen snow. Many plants can contribute to the serene winter ambiance due to certain characteristics such as unique shape, colorful winter berries, seed

pods that linger through the winter, bark color and texture, evergreen needles or leaves, and unusual branching patterns. When designing a landscape, it is not necessary to think of winter as "down time" for visual appeal. Be creative, incorporating some of the many plants with fascinating winter interest into your landscape. You may just want to stay out in the garden all year long!
